

The advantages of an all-girls education

Self-confidence and **personal belief** are vital lessons to be learnt from your time at school; lessons that an all-girls education will deliver in abundance.

The **freedom** to be yourself, not contained within the parameters of gender stereotyping, is vital for any young person and increasingly so in this, sometimes confusing, digital world.

Just as boys will be boys, so **girls will be girls**. In an all-female environment the necessity to temper personality and aspiration is removed. In the 2018s GCSE national results table, all-girls schools achieved first and second place.

These formidable results are backed-up by a recent study by the Institute of Physics which showed that pupils from all-girl independent schools are significantly more likely to study the science subject, at an advanced level, than pupils from any other type of school.

An all-girl environment dispels the myth of a so-called 'girls topic'. The national average for girls leaving school to pursue a university **STEM** (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) subject is 24% (source: WISE 2016/17). **This year, 65% of Kilgraston girls were offered places to study these subjects at undergraduate level.**

Our result has taken investment and commitment. From the age of ten, Kilgraston pupils are taught the Sciences by subject-specific specialists with no restriction or expectation based on gender.

Learning to be who you are, and who you want to be, is an unparalleled part of educational journey. In a girls-only environment, pupils are encouraged to reach for every opportunity, be it in the classroom, sports field or school orchestra.

Within a single-sex environment, leadership and **female ambition** is something that is expected, encouraged and taken seriously by everyone concerned.

Once reaching the co-ed world of tertiary education or the workplace, girls will have fully developed their own personality, drive and aspirations.

At Kilgraston, girls focus on who they wish to become, while enjoying being who they want to be. One of our former pupils has just been offered a place at the British Army's tough Royal Military Academy. Single sex education is a liberation, not a restriction.

This year, every pupil leaving Kilgraston went to the university of their choice.

As one pupil puts it: "You always feel confident."
