# JUNIOR SCHOOL

Our Junior School introduces pupils to our special Kilgraston care; the happy atmosphere of a family blended with an educational environment that encourages young children to develop to the very best of their individual abilities in sport, music, art, drama, technology and academics.

WELCOME TO KILGRASTON'S

The Kilgraston Junior School is for children aged between five and twelve years with boarding available for girls aged eight and over.

The focus is clearly on intellectual development, encouraging natural curiosity, personal endeavour, determination and achievement in all areas of the curriculum. Emphasis is placed on skills that allow individual pupils to pursue their learning in the classroom and beyond.

At the top of our Junior School pupils are given responsibilities such as House Captains, Sports Captains,



prefects or buddies. Children of all ages also join our Pupil Council, 'Eco' Committee, Charities Committee or become Librarians to help to develop their social awareness.

All of the Junior School pupils have a BFG assigned to them (a Big Friendly Girl). BFGs are Upper Sixth pupils who play a 'big sister' role to younger pupils and younger children can turn to their BFG at any time.

### WHAT WE TEACH AND WHERE WE GO

We are extremely fortunate to have a varied and dynamic curriculum in Junior School. Each day, there are six lessons, covering a wealth of academic subjects and skills. Maths and literacy lessons are taught daily. The curriculum also includes an exciting science programme filled with experiments and inquiry-based learning. Modern languages, PE, RE and Expressive Arts are all popular subjects and music often fills the glass atrium where Juniors meet for our morning activities programme (including yoga, circus skills and singing). A broad variety of afterschool activities augments the curriculum and finishes the school day.

Outdoor education, in the grounds at Kilgraston and beyond, is embedded in our teaching. Our termly topics often feature an exciting class trip, which brings history or geography to life. Recent visits include educational excursions to the Science Centre, Scottish Parliament, V&A Dundee, National Museum of Scotland and the Titanic Museum in Belfast.

The Eco club are keen ambassadors and actively campaign against single use plastics and plan to recycle plastic bottles into a kayak to launch in the burn, which runs through the School grounds. Becoming a rewilding school and a sanctuary for native species is their next ambitious step.



# EXPRESSIVE ARTS IN THE JUNIOR SCHOOL

Kilgraston prides itself on its strength in Expressive Arts, and it starts with our Junior School. Our pupils have one Music lesson each week in class which focuses on singing, learning musical notation, playing various instruments and listening to different styles of music. All pupils in our Junior School are part of the choir and some may also be invited to join the Junior School orchestra. There is also the option to take instrumental or singing lessons with specialist music teachers.

Art is embedded into our weekly curriculum with pupils getting the chance to paint and draw as part of the class topics. This includes a variety of items such our Reception and Lower First classes making their very own Viking Boat.

Each class also receives one Drama lesson each week, either with the class teacher or with our specialist drama teacher. For those looking to strengthen their performing skills, each term we have a Junior Showcase; the perfect platform to perform individually to an audience. Kilgraston also hosts House competitions in subjects such as music, art and poetry, and these involve pupils from Reception up to Upper Sixth.

Kilgraston Juniors also feature prominently in a number of external events including our annual spectacular Christmas concert at Perth Concert Hall, and the Perform in Perth competition where we always take home a huge number of awards for categories including music, reciting poetry and singing. Our superb Junior School show takes place each year, where all our Junior Year pupils can dance, sing, and act.





# THE LIFE OF A JUNIOR SCHOOL PUPIL

"A Kilgraston day is like every other school, but better in every way. Your very first lesson depends on the timetable, but it will probably be Maths, English or Social Studies.

# **SPORT**

Junior Years pupils have PE lessons on three days each week, one of which is a swimming lesson in Kilgraston's fantastic indoor 25 metre pool.

# JUNIOR YEARS BOARDING

Mater boarding house and Austin dormitories are home to our junior and middle school boarders. The youngest members – from eight to twelve years of age live in the Austin dorms. Each dorm houses either three or four girls and has its own shower and toilet facilities as well as a common room. At thirteen, most girls are given their own study bedroom in Mater. Each spacious and bright room is fitted with a comfortable single bed, a desk and ample storage space.

Boarding gives pupils a feeling that they have 'come home' once they head back to the residential area after school. After activities there is some quiet time to get homework completed with support from the boarding team before supper. In the evening, if you take a walk through boarding, it is not unusual to find one group of girls playing monopoly whilst another is experimenting with some Chemistry, making the ubiquitous 'slime'.

The girls from all Kilgraston's boarding areas come together at mealtimes, and the Sixth Form girls help out and visit Austin and Mater almost every day. It is also common to see (and hear) all our boarders on the front lawn enjoying a massive game of 'Capture the Flag'.

There is no doubt that boarding forges a community atmosphere where lifelong friends are made; girls don't only look after themselves; they need to live and work with others of all ages.



# **FOOD**

Kilgraston is proud to have its own fantastic in-house catering team. We aim to inspire excellent eating habits, so that children understand the benefits of eating well.

We encourage our pupils to take a 'colourful' plate each day at lunchtime, and there is a huge amount of choice including a well-stocked salad bar, soup and main dish options.

Kilgraston provides morning snack each day, and a snack after school if the pupil is staying on to take part in activities or study club; we also provide packed lunches when we go out on trips.
